THE RECORD

9 of 11 YEARS

Cuyahoga County spent more than it collected in nine of the last eleven years, 2015 through 2025.

\$262.9M SHORTFALL

The gap between county spending and county revenue in 2025 alone.

24.1% vs 10.6% SPENDING VS REVENUE

From 2022 to 2025, county spending grew more than twice as fast as revenue.

510 ADDED EMPLOYEES

Positions added to the county payroll under the current administration — an estimated \$42 million a year in new spending.

\$582 A YEAR, PER HOME

What the two county levies on this ballot cost the average West Shore homeowner. The median Cuyahoga suburb pays \$393.
